CONFERENCE PRESENTERS

Darlene Berryman, PhD Dr. Berryman is a registered dietitian with a doctoral degree in nutritional sciences from Cornell University. Since graduate school, she has taught nutrition at Ithaca College in upstate New York and worked as an independent contract lecturer giving nutrition seminars to health care professionals around the nation. Currently, she is an associate professor in Nutrition at Ohio University and the director of the Diabetes Research Initiative. Her current research interests focus on the diet and endocrine control of obesity.

Mary Beth Blankenship, MSN, FNP: I received my education from Ohio University and Marshall University. I am Board Certified as a Family Nurse Practitioner in Advanced Practice and am Board Certified as a Generalist in Gerontology. I have a Bachelor's Degree in Sociology and focus on issues in Appalachia. I am an Assistant

Professor for Ohio University Southern Campus and Main Campus in Athens where I teach nursing and am clinical faculty for Nurse Practitioner students

Sharon A. Denham, DSN, RN: Professor of nursing at Ohio University with a nursing doctorate from the University of Alabama at Birmingham. Professional roles include offices in the Family and Health Section of the National Council on Family Relations, the Appalachian Studies Association, service on the Board of Commissioner for the National League of Nursing Accreditation Commission, and present-elect to the International Family Nurses Association.. She serves as Director of OU's Appalachian Rural Health Institute. She has numerous publications including a book entitled *Family Health: A Framework for Nursing* and is recognized for Appalachian culture and family nursing expertise.

Ruth Dudding, BS, CHES: Ruth is a Certified Health Education Specialist at the Athens City-County Health Department. Her work focuses on creating healthier communities through environmental design, policy development and system changes. Ruth chairs a Healthy Community Coalition which includes members of the health care, worksite, school and community settings in Athens County. The Healthy Community Coalition addresses the issues of improving nutrition, increasing physical activity and eliminating tobacco use. Ruth received her Bachelor's of Science degree in Community Health from Ohio University.

Margaret Manoogian, PhD: Dr. Manoogian is an Associate professor in Ohio University's School of Human and Consumer Science. She has her doctorate in human development and family studies with minors in adult development, aging, and women's studies. She has refereed publications in the area of family studies that include poverty, intergenerational issues, and concerns of rural families and has given several presentations on these topics. She has been involved with the diabetes research for this project and assisted with expert input on the toolkit development.
